Cyberbully guilty of child rape, murder

CYBERBULLY Itumeleng Bendow Machabe, 37, was found guilty of the rape and murder of 11-year-old Relebogile Segami, as well as enticing young girls to share naked pictures that were exchanged on WhatsApp and Facebook.

Machabe was convicted on 18 out of a total of 19 charges in the Northern Cape High Court on February 12, including raping three minors between the ages of 13-15 years old, extortion, fraud, crimen injuria and child pornography.

Relebogile had followed the accused after he promised to give her R20. She was strangled to death, and her body was discarded in the veld behind the Northern Cape Provincial Legislature in March 2022.

Machabe lured his victims through a fake Facebook account and posted explicit videos and their nude full-body pictures. He also blackmailed his victims by threatening to post their naked images on social media.

He pretended to be a 16-year-old, gay female who purported to be attending Christian Brothers College or Northern Cape Technical High School.

Machabe maintained that he had consensual sexual intercourse with his victims and claimed that someone had changed his password on Facebook.

He stated that his cellphone was damaged after it fell into the water and blamed his girlfriend for refusing to return his cellphone after discovering that he was communicating with his "other girlfriends".

State advocate Elmari Kruger told the court on Wednesday this week that Segami's family was left devastated and heartbroken.

"Her sister Refilwe was the last family member to see Relebogile alive. Their mother is suffering from depression and is taking medication. She indicated that she does not have the mental strength to deal with Refilwe's angry outbursts. Her family is still struggling to deal with her death," said Kruger.

She stated that the court had a responsibility to deal harshly with acts of gender-based violence and femicide.

"Relebogile was killed in a heinous manner, where her body was dumped in the veld. Society is outraged over what happened."

Kruger pointed out that Machabe had inflicted deep psychological scars on traumatised teenagers, who became suicidal and depressed.

"The 13-year-old girl was familiar with the accused and was a virgin prior to being raped. The case dragged on for two years and she failed her grades. The traumatic incident stole two years of her life. She was still very emotional when she testified, even though the incident happened 11 years ago.

"They (the young victims) were embarrassed and hid themselves from the rest of the world, out of fear that people would recognise them from their naked pictures. They related that they would never have befriended the accused on Facebook had they known that he was an adult male."

She added that Machabe threatened to expose a 15-year-old girl's naked pictures to her friends – who had abandoned her and treated her like an outcast.

"Her identity was used to lure more victims. She cries every day and tried to take her own life by overdosing on her mother's diabetes medication. She harmed herself by cutting herself with razor blades. She was bullied on social media and was afraid that the accused would target more girls through the use of her identity."

Kruger said a 15-year-old complainant felt ashamed after the accused threatened to make her naked pictures "go viral" if she failed to send him a lewd video of herself inserting a pencil into her anus.

"The complainant was not able to go through with it. She felt like a failure and was worried that someone would see the video."

Kruger stated that another complainant, who was 14 years old at the time of the incident, had also tried to commit suicide.

"She failed matric as she was not able to attend classes for three years and lost her self-confidence. She feared that people would recognise her from the naked pictures. She took Allergex pills in order to sleep at night. After she fell pregnant, she was worried that her daughter would suffer the same fate. She questions the motives of anyone who professes their love for her."

Kruger revealed that another 15-year-old girl was "slapped into submission" by Machabe, who threatened to kill her if she told anyone that he had forced her to have oral and anal sex with him.

"She suffered painful injuries and was assaulted when she refused to co-operate when he urinated in her mouth."

Kruger pointed out that many of the offences carried minimum sentences of life imprisonment.

Machabe's legal representative, advocate Sakkie Nel, requested the court to consider that his client was young and was capable of being rehabilitated.

"Since 2013, there have been no convictions against him. He is a first-offender and is too young to spend his life in prison," said Nel.

Judge Cecile Williams believed that Machabe was a "dishonest and unreliable" witness who fabricated evidence.

"There is a pattern in the manner in which he approached his young victims," she noted.

She also pointed out that Machabe had raped and murdered Relebogile after he had been released on bail. "She knew the accused and trusted him."

Williams noted that the post-mortem results indicated that Relebogile was a virgin before she was raped.

She also indicated that the injuries suffered by the complainants were not consistent with consensual sexual intercourse.

"The family of one of the complainants decided to withdraw the charges of rape as the case was dragging on. The complainant did not wish to be subjected to the trauma of testifying. Her teachers were also complaining that she was missing classes as she had to frequently attend court," Williams said.

Sentencing is expected to be handed down on February 18.

Justice served: Conviction brings some closure in child rape, murder case

COMMUNITY members and the family of 11-year-old Relebogile Segami are satisfied that justice has prevailed after her killer, Itumeleng Bendow Machabe, 37, was convicted of her murder and rape by the Northern Cape High Court on Wednesday.

Relebogile's aunt and family spokesperson, Jennifer Leroux, said they were finally able to find closure.

"We are relieved, even though Relebogile's mother is suffering from severe mental strain and is now bedridden. The emotional and physical damage caused by Relebogile's death has taken its toll. Relebogile was her second youngest child out of five siblings," said Leroux.

The trial spanned nearly three years, during which cases were withdrawn, struck off the roll, and later reinstated, while delays were experienced due to inconclusive DNA results.

Leroux extended her gratitude to the courts, the justice system, prosecutors and the team of investigators for ensuring the protection of the rights of the complainants.

"We are thankful to the community at large, every individual and gender-based violence advocate, for their unwavering support and solidarity in the pursuit of justice," she added.

"We appreciate the kindness, empathy and understanding of State advocate Elmarie Kruger, who handled our daughter's case with professionalism and dedication. The investigation team was diligent in uncovering the truth and seeking justice for all the complainants.

"We are deeply grateful for the fair and just judgment rendered by the honourable court,

which has finally brought closure and justice to this case."

Community activist Herbert Miller vowed to continue advocating for victims of gender-based violence and femicide (GBVF), emphasising the importance of holding perpetrators accountable.

"It was an uphill battle, but thanks to the investigating team led by Sergeant Gwyneth Paulsen, cybercrime experts and the prosecutors ensured that the accused, who poses a danger to society, will hopefully be locked up for a very long time," said Miller.

EFF councillor Ponscho Mocwana also welcomed the court's judgment against what he called a "serial rapist and killer."

"The judgment enforces the rights of victims of GBVF, brutality and poor socio-economic circumstances. The gruesome rape, murder and violations of innocent children deserve multiple life sentences," said Mocwana.

He was concerned that GBVF complainants were being subjected to further victimisation by having to wait several years for their trials to conclude.

"This proves that our courts are dealing with a conundrum of cases and at times difficulty in gathering credible and incriminating evidence to ensure a successful prosecution.

"We would, however, like to commend the work of the SAPS, social workers, and the National Prosecuting Authority in ensuring that the perpetrator faces the full might of the law."

Mocwana also urged community members to continue rallying behind victims of GBVF.

"The overwhelming support shown for the victims and the public uproar, demonstrate how evil deeds disturb the lives of victims as well as the wider community," he concluded.

As an aside, I once witnessed a woman, here in Kimberley, who pushed an overflowing shopping cart to the 10-item till. On that occasion the cashier did protest, saying that it's unfair to the other customers.

The woman didn't flinch. "You can scan my items 10 at a time, and I will pay for each batch," she said matter-of-factly, as the rest of us in the queue fumed silently.

We tend to do that in South Africa – be silently frustrated.

However, seeing as I had earned outlaw status, I took a different approach, when I had a hostile confrontation with none other than one of those dreaded 'law-into-themselves' minibus-taxi drivers.

Here's my version of how it unfolded: On this day, I came up behind two minibuses at a red traffic light. One taxi opened its doors and five people disembarked just as the light turned green. The passengers then walked over to the second taxi and started boarding.

I was behind this second taxi, and I rolled my eyes as I remarked to my passengers, "Gee whizz, they don't even use their 'hazards' any more."

Now it happened that the passengers took so long to board that by the time they were all seated, the light had turned red again. Finally, the light turned green and the taxi door opened and a few passengers started to disembark. I shook my head in disbelief.

Now I wasn't in a hurry, frustrated or angry at this. I had good music playing on my sound system, my aircon made the car rather pleasant and I had loads of time on my hands. But I decided to have some fun.

I hooted. But not just a 'beep'. I laid on the hooter, sending out the longest honk that my car ever emitted – at least 10 seconds long.

The disembarking passengers angrily gesticulated at me, but I was in good spirits. I winked, smiled and waved at them.

Then the driver inched forward, and waited just across the barrier line, waiting for the light to turn red, so that he could punish me for my impudence.

What he did not know is that I have been driving for 40 years, and have owned my car for over a decade, so I know a few tricks ... I wiggled free from the spite trap and easily zoomed past him.

Now I was ahead of him.

There was another traffic light just ahead, and revenge was on the menu.

Relax ... the revenge I meted out was showing this young, immature, proud person that our city's roads are not a battlefield where we compete for ascendancy, but a common area where we need to learn to co-operate, be kind, courteous and accommodating so that everyone feels valued and, above all, safe.

When the light turned green, I proceeded on my way without the slightest delay, knowing that in his vehicle were at least 20 people who were depending on him to get them to their destination safely and quickly.

SPU students protest as unpaid fees soar to nearly R80 million

SOL PLAATJE University (SPU) said it was not in a position to offer free tertiary education, while students owe nearly R80 million in unpaid fees.

Students set tyres alight outside Sol Plaatje University Square on Wednesday, demanding free tertiary education, more funded student accommodation, fairer debt repayment policies, and increased financial support.

"We are prepared to take a stand and occupy the university premises. We will sleep on the premises if necessary, just like other varsity students did, to highlight the harsh reality that many of us face. We have no accommodation, no financial support and no access to education," the embattled students stated.

Sol Plaatje University director of institutional advancement Kashini Maistry said about 60 students blocked access points on Wednesday.

"There were no reports of intimidation or damage to university property. The entrances were reopened by the University Campus Security," said Maistry.

She stated that as of January 31, about 250 students had made payments, including new students who were required to make upfront payments.

Maistry explained that SPU students with historical debt were mainly unfunded students and not National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) beneficiaries.

"Of these, 934 undergraduate students owe a total of R65.2 million in outstanding fees and 435 postgraduate students owe R14.4 million in debt."

She said that students were demanding to register for the 2025 academic year without making any payment toward their existing debt.

"It is financially unsustainable for higher education institutions to provide free education."

Maistry said that university man-

agement, together with the student representative council, had agreed to allow indebted students to register for the 2025 academic year.

"Students owing up to R25,000 who were previously registered in 2024 will be required to sign an acknowledgment of debt and proceed with registration.

"Students owing more than R25,001 who were previously registered in 2024 will be expected to reduce their debt to R25,000 and must sign an acknowledgement of debt before registration."

She added that exceptional cases would be considered by the university on a case-by-case basis through the Financial Aid and Scholarships Appeals Committee.

"The university is committed to assisting students who do not have funding through various initiatives. The university will cover the tuition fees for undergraduate students who pass all subjects on their first attempt. This assistance is designed to ensure that eligible students are not hindered by financial constraints, provided they maintain academic excellence."

Maistry indicated that postgraduate students who achieved an average pass rate of 65 percent would be assisted with their tuition fees in recognition of their academic performance.

"Postgraduate students can also approach the National Research Foundation for further assistance.

"The Student Graduate Fund assists final-year undergraduate students who meet the eligibility criteria. The fund aims to assist with financial barriers that might prevent them from completing their studies."

She added that the university was also engaging with donors to assist in clearing the historic debt of final-year undergraduate students or recent graduates within their catchment areas.
